✓ Include the society mission/ vision statements in publications and at meetings.
✓ Share information of the Society's legacy. Consider viewing "Pride in the Big Picture" orientation presentation and/or "Sustaining Pride in the Big Picture" presentation.

✓ Be aware of communication. What methods work best: social media, electronic communication, phone calls, or personal visits?

Reports of the death of a member on Form 6, along with an obituary, can still be sent to Susan Graham by the chapter president until July 1. The information will be forwarded to the incoming membership chairman.
